Kulturkirche Altona

If you want to take your event to new heights, the St. Johankirche in Altona is a guaranteed winner. The neo-Gothic building, inaugurated in 1873, has been used as a location since 2011 - for corporate and private events that are simply heavenly!







The basilica, built according to the design of architect Johannes Otzen, with its yellow glazed brick and narrow side aisles, is a gem of church architecture. But that's not all: in combination with the stained glass windows and the paintings by Michel Welter, the interior of the event church also shines with art and history.

The pews, which are not permanently installed, allow for a variety of seating arrangements, from stylish gala dinners to lively parties, for which individual event technology is also used to illuminate the vaults with additional colors.




